Since its inception in 2006, Jubilate has grown from a 12-member treble choir to a 45-member choir with individual treble, baritone, and liturgical choirs, in addition to the full SATB choir. The choir will perform at Carnegie Hall in April 2010.

Jubilate (pronounced yoo-bih-LAH-tey) is a co-ed choir of talented young people.
