



Jubilate Performance Christens the Community Room at the Opening Celebration of Warwick's New Library

Jubilate Community Youth Choir of Warwick was honored to be the inaugural performance in the Community Room of the new Albert Wisner Public Library at the opening celebration on Sunday, November 15, 2009 in Warwick. Librarian Lisa Laico (shown above), a member of the Jubilate steering committee, introduced the choir and welcomed a "full house" to the first of many events planned for the multi-purpose room.

Jubilate performed for 20 minutes at this celebration of relocation into a new, "green" building four times the size of the original AWPL building that served the area for 82 years. It was a great day for Warwick and an affirmation of the importance of a public library in the life of a healthy community.

Established in 2006 in Warwick, Jubilate (pronounced yoo-bih-LAH-tey) is a forty-five member, co-ed choir of talented young people. Christ Church, Warwick sponsors the choir and provides rehearsal space. Jubilate has performed at local houses of worship, public concerts, community events, St. Paul's Chapel at Ground Zero, a Sussex Skyhawks baseball game, and with locally and nationally-known artists in the pop, bluegrass, folk, rock and classical music genres.
