



Jubilate's Winter Concert features Brass Quintet

"Wintery mix" conditions spoiled the view but not the festive mood on December 13 at Jubilate's *Go Tell It on the Mountain* concert at The Warwick Center. Jubilate, the Hudson Valley's premier community youth choir, has grown from a 12-member treble choir in 2006 to a 45-member choir with individual treble, baritone, and liturgical choirs, in addition to the full SATB choir. On November 15 Jubilate was honored to be the inaugural performer in the Community Room of the new Albert Wisner Public Library at its opening celebration. The choir is holding winter auditions on January 12, and will perform at Carnegie Hall in April 2010.

Jubilate (pronounced yoo-bih-LAH-tey) is a co-ed choir of talented young people. Jubilate has performed at houses of worship including St. Paul's Chapel at Ground Zero, community concerts and events, and with locally and nationally-known artists spanning from pop to classical music genres.
